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FUNDING SUPPORT FLOWS IN

ANOTHER round of support from State and local governments and other organisations has again helped the Historic Leyburn Sprints hit the track in 2022.

The Oueensland Government has contributed \$25,000 through its Queensland Events Destination Program (QEDP), continuing its long-standing backing of one of the Southern Downs region's most valuable

The money has been used to market the Sprints to visitors outside the region and to develop an all-new event website.

Southern Downs Regional Council is sponsoring the Sprints to the tune of \$7,100, while the national governing body Motorsport Australia provided \$500 for the purchase of shade equipment.

The event organisers also have welcomed a major grant of \$33,000 from the Queensland Government's Gambling Community Benefit Fund.

This is Queensland's largest one-off community grants distributes program and approximately \$60 million each year to not-for-profit

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
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IT'S CAR WARS, 1916 STYLE

THE adage "win on Sunday, sell on Monday" is familiar to modern-day motorsport enthusiasts, but who knew it was applied when the invention of the motor car was barely three decades old? Or that Surfers Paradise beach, famous later for IndyCar and Supercar races, was the setting for an historic showdown between dealers contenders way back in 1916?

That's the scenario for the book Car Wars Down Under, the four-wheel protagonists in which will make a real-life appearance at the Historic Leyburn Sprints this weekend.

Graham Crittenden's wellknown 1912 Willys "Whitey" has made past visits to Leyburn, but this is the first time we'll see it alongside its old foe, the Studebaker Six of Gavin Mutton and Loretta Marron OAM. The cars will be on display near the main intersection of the Sprints precinct and are expected to do parade laps during the lunch

The book by local author Murray Hubbard is subtitled The Untold Story of Australia's First Land Speed Record.


The Willys was driven by Fred Eager and the Studebaker by Alec Jewell, representing importer Canada Cycle & Motor, when the cars lined up on the beach on Christmas Day 1916.

The Studebaker won, but you will have to read the book to find out its speed and winning margin.

Despite this victory, it was the Eagers company that survived to become today one of Australia's biggest motor dealers.

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HUTCHINSON TAKES '21 SPOILS

A DESPERATE last effort clinched a fourth outright win for driver Warwick Hutchinson at the 2021 Historic Leyburn Sprints.

After duelling all weekend, Hutchinson trailed rival Brett Bull until he crossed the line on his ninth and last run.

Bull, driving a Van Diemen single-seater, booked his best time of 42.365 seconds on the ninth run and with a margin of 0.189s looked set to win his first Col Furness Memorial Trophy.

But Hutchinson, next in line for the start, flung his Mazda rotary-powered OMS28 around the track in 42.271s to claim his first Sprints victory since 2013.

"This trophy is close to my heart. I've been up here several times and it's good to be back," the Brisbane driver said.

"Brett was in front most of the weekend and it was a really close battle. That was very satisfying to beat him on the very last run.

In the Historic classes, Brad Stratton set the fastest time of 55.225s in a 1962 Elfin Mallala

sports car.

Thomas Rath, driving a Suzuki Swift, won the Ann Collins Memorial Junior Award

setting the most consistent times among drivers aged between 14 and 17.

The 25th-anniversary Sprints

lived up to its reputation as one of the most popular and enjoyable events on the historic motorsport calendar.





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Sprints President Tricia Chant said that although competitor numbers were down slightly without interstate entries due to Covid-19, plus a Covid-forced three-week postponement to 11-12 September, the event provided plenty of action and entertainment.

"We've faced some challenges in the past couple of years after having to cancel the 2020 event and postpone this year's by three weeks, but there was no sign of that at the weekend - everyone seemed to have a great time," she said.

Crowd-pleasing highlights included demonstration runs by an ear-splitting Ford Fusion NASCAR once raced in America by Australian champion Marcos Ambrose and piloted at Leyburn by Supercar driver Brodie Kostecki.

At the other end of the speed spectrum, Australia's oldest log-booked racing car, the 1922 Wikner Ford Special owned for 63 years by Doug Partington, took Leyburn Legend Dick Johnson on a parade lap to the applause of thousands of fans. Johnson was joined at the Sprints by his

son Steven and grandson Jett, who was competing in a Ford Escort, then an Aussie car.

Kostecki and fellow first-time visitor, former Supercar team owner Ross Stone, praised the event atmosphere.

"I'm asking myself what have I been missing out on. It's got such a good feeling and it's such a good event, I'll come back," said Stone, honoured alongside Dick Johnson and other senior motorsport personalities as one of 2021's Leyburn Legends.

Kostecki took time away from his usual Erebus Motorsport duties to run the NASCAR in public in Australia for the first time

"Everyone loved the sound of the NASCAR - it revs to 9000RPM and sounds unique," he said.

"It was great to see so many people and so many cars - quite different to what I've been doing.

"It's been nice to sit a few kids in my car for photographs."

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SPRINTS' RUN OF CHAMPIONS

AN impressive variety of drivers and cars, from a Formula 5000 to a genuine Ford GT40 to a locallydeveloped sports car, have won the coveted Col Furness Memorial Trophy for outright fastest time at the Historic Leyburn Sprints.

Interestingly, the fastest time also was one of the earliest, set at 37.93 seconds by the late Ivan Tighe in a Chevron B37 singleseater at the second Sprints in 1997. Subsequent track changes and unfavourable weather have meant a new record is still 1.86sec. away for the fastest current runner, Dean Amos.

Could 2022 finally be the year for a new mark?




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
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


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VALE SPRINTS STALWARTS

THE number panels on the doors of Sprint entries this weekend carry a very special feature – a tribute to two long-serving and treasured members of the event organising committee, Mike Collins and John Mellon, who passed away this year.

Mike, the Sprints co-founder and popular Race Director for 25 years, died in June at the age of 74. John, equally well known, was Assistant Race Director and a Sprints Life Member when he passed away in January at the age of 79.

Placing their names on every one of the 200-plus cars competing this weekend is a fitting tribute to these two stalwarts of the Historic Leyburn Sprints, who oversaw the participation of around 1400 drivers during their time. Additionally, Mike's name will be added alongside that of his late first wife Ann on what will now be known as the Mike and Ann Collins Memorial Junior Award trophy.



The annual Juniors perpetual trophy will be named after Mike and Ann Collins.

Until his retirement and 2021 marriage to his second wife Lyn Zirbel, Mike operated Collins Hay, a major contractor supplying hay throughout rural Queensland.

But his first love, after family, was motorsport. He competed in races and rallies from a young

age and could be seen driving one of his own cars every year in the Sprints competition.

The newest of these cars was a 1965 Ford Mustang, which he purchased in the United States to contest the 2012 Pikes Peak hillclimb in Colorado. The red Mustang was brought home later to Australia and became a familiar machine at not only the Sprints but also at rounds of the Australian Trans-Am Championship. Mike was preparing to return to spectate at Pikes Peak when sadly his health declined.

The Historic Leyburn Sprints was launched after Mike, Ann and other community members saw an opportunity to commemorate the running of the 1949 Australian Grand Prix.

"Realising the significance of 1999 as the 50th anniversary of the Australian Grand Prix in Leyburn, I thought we could lay the platform for a huge celebration," he said at the time.

It was a prescient move. The Sprints has become one of Australia's premier events for historic and classic cars, a highlight of the Southern Darling Downs annual events calendar and a substantial economic contributor to the local community.



Mike's daughter Tricia Chant, the current Sprints President, said her father left a wonderful legacy.

"He was a gentleman and a gentle man, loved and respected throughout the motorsport community as an enthusiastic racer, but above all as a hardworking big bloke who helped put our little town of Leyburn on the map and brought its community huge social and economic benefits."

The gentle giant's tireless and unstinting volunteering was matched by John Mellon, an irreplaceably popular member of the Leyburn community.

Tricia Chant recalls that as John loved the Sprints and Leyburn, they loved him back.

"The Sprints Committee was like a second family to John and the Royal Hotel his second home. He loved absolutely everything to do with Leyburn; competitors and officials loved him.

year "Each he would religiously mark out camp sites for all competitors who asked and nothing was ever too much trouble.

"There are only a handful of people who we ever get to meet who epitomise what it means to belong to a small town.

"Descriptions that come to

mind include pride, passion and participation. Pride for their community, passion for wanting that community to prosper and participating to make that happen. John was definitely up

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TINY TOWN HAS A RICH HISTORY

GOLD fever, Cobb & Co., wartime spy flights, Queensland's oldest licensed premises, a famous footballer and, of course, a grand prix motor race: for such a small district, Leyburn packs an extraordinary history.

The 2021 Commonwealth census put Leyburn's population at 566 people, but there were times when many more found their way to this village 220 kms west of Brisbane.

The locality's first white settler, in the 1840s, was said to be William Gray. His daughter Jane and her husband Henry Kirby gave it the name Leyburn, after a town in Yorkshire, England.

The site for Leyburn, Queensland, was surveyed in November 1852. Henry Kirby and another man named Collins (no relation to Mike and Ann Collins) applied in 1854 for the licence of the Travellers' Home Inn, then in 1858 James Murray erected his Coffee Room Inn and Boarding House.


This became known later as the Granall Residence and remains in surprisingly good condition in Macintyre Street, opposite the 1863-licensed Royal Hotel.

This property is now owned by Kyran and Janet Sprott, who are proud to preserve and showcase the history of this important feature of Leyburn.

The Royal and many other establishments were built to service a bustling gold-mining community during the 1860s, until most of the hopefuls decamped for Gympie, north of Brisbane. Leyburn's post office and police station opened in 1861, the State school in 1862, the Royal Hotel Leyburn in 1863, St Augustine's Anglican Church in 1871.

Farming and timber-getting mostly occupied residents for the next 80 years. And then the second world war came to put Leyburn on the map forever.





About five km north of the township, authorities in early 1943 built a 2,100 metre airstrip for the US Army Air Force.

Intended originally as a base for Liberator heavy bombers in the event of Japanese invasion, the aerodrome eventually saw flights depart on secret reconnaissance missions south-east Asia.

The Australian 21 Squadron, 23 Squadron and 99 Squadron also used the strip and Wirraway training and general purpose aircraft were a common sight in local skies. At times until it was abandoned in 1945, the Leyburn airfield hosted up to 1300 personnel, but it was to get a massive, one-off boost when the

two runways and linking roads were used for the 1949 Australian Grand Prix.

Contemporary reports said 30,000 people attended the race on 18 September and saw John Crouch win in a French

Delahaye.

The Toowoomba Auto Club staged more races in the early 1950s, when future world champion Jack Brabham was a competitor in his famous Redex Special, Jack Brabham won the **QLD** Road Racing Championship at Leyburn in 1953.

Today, plagues on Macquarie Drive commemorate the grand prix and the wartime activities, while more obvious reminders are the names on local roads Delahaye Drive, Wirraway Avenue and Liberator Place - and Liberator Park on the entrance to

obsessional following throughout regional Queensland, former Broncos captain and State of Origin and Australian representative Shane Webcke is one of Leyburn's favourite sons.

His reputation as one of the world's greatest players of his era has continued to bring attention to Leyburn, where he was once the publican and still has farming interests.

In 2022, Shane joined the Historic Leyburn **Sprints** committee, as he is so passionate about the town that he wanted to broaden his support.

M. CAMPBELL (1972 ASP 330-2, 1600CC)


It's hardly imaginable that a former chippy from Warwick has progressed from the Rookie of the Year award at the Historic Leyburn Sprints to becoming a factory Porsche driver in the running for victory at the Le Mans 24 Hours.

That's Matt Campbell, the now-27-year-old who thrilled his family and supporters at home in Warwick and Leyburn with recent news he has graduated to the most elite level in world sports car racing.

The new Porsche 963 LMDH hybrids will contest the FIA World Endurance Championship and America's IMSA Weather Tech Sports Car Championship in 2023. Within that program, Campbell's targets will include Le Mans and the 24 Hours of Daytona and 12 Hours of Sebring in the fastest closed racing cars on the planet.

The grandson and former





building apprentice of Morgan Park Raceway founder, the late Bill Campbell, is well known to Southern Downs locals. His most recent appearance at Leyburn was in 2015 in an historic Asp single-seater, but by then he was already on his path to stardom via a variety of series including Formula Ford, Supercars and Porsches at home and overseas.

"I think it was around late 2014 we were sat in a cafe in Brisbane writing down the details of how we were going to do this on a napkin and what we wanted to try and achieve," Matt recently told speedcafe.com.

"Now we've been able to tick off every one of those boxes; a lot has happened since then and it's very special.

"If it wasn't for all those people I wouldn't be in such a position, I'd probably still be a builder in my hometown of Warwick."

Sprints President Tricia Chant congratulated Campbell.

"What a dream come true for a very talented guy from Warwick! Matt started out running a Datsun at Morgan Park Raceway guided by his late grandfather Bill Campbell.

"He completed a building apprenticeship with his grandad all the while working hard to achieve his dream. He also won the Leyburn Sprints inaugural 'rookie' trophy a few years back.


"We can't wait to see what the next few years brings for Matt."




